March Comment: Dominated by high pressure in the last half of the month bringing cold easterly winds. Significant snow for the northern 2/3rds of Britain; no snow for us, only rain most of which fell between 15 and 22 March. In the last week of the month continuing cold and dry but with some added brightness whereas the first part of the month had much cloud along with the chill. Not very spring like! With yet another month of higher than average rainfall, the 12 month period from 1 April 2012 to 31 March 2013 has yielded 55.6 inches of rainfall. It does not surprise me that you do not have to dig deep to get to wet soil!
