Walking on the Trailway

Whether you are out for a short walk with the dog, taking your children for a leisurely stroll, or taking part in some strenuous long distance walking, then you can do no better than use the North Dorset Trailway. People in the villages and towns along, or with links to the Trailway

have numerous access points onto the Trailway, which offers a firm surface. safe crossing points, stiles, and most importantly is free from motorised traffic. There are links to the Stour Valley Way, The Wessex Ridge-The Jubilee way, Trail. and Hod and Hambledon Hills. Open Access land and nature reserves and woods such as Piddles Wood and Blandford Forest are within easy walking distance Trailway. of the Throughout the year, there is always something of interest for walkers along the Trailway, the focus changing with the progression of the seasons.
