Behold a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel, which means God with us.



May we all rediscover the magic of Christmas this year.

Temperatures higher than average generally, but with few bright blue cloudless days and so no Indian Summer. Mind you some people say that there can only be an Indian Summer if there has been a frost so we have missed out on two counts. Apple trees have been laden with excellent fruit and "help yourself" boxes began to appear at front gates with fine samples of fruit. In the veggie patch, French beans have done wonderfully well; others may have had different bumper crops.

The warm and damp conditions of September continued into October and with 6 rainless days on the trot towards the beginning of the month there was the possibility of a well below average total. Increasingly showery and blustery stuff from the Atlantic then took over, culminating in the St Jude storm during the night of $26/27^{th}$ of the month which dumped 31mm onto us and, with gusts of 70mph, knocked over a fair few trees closing roads and cutting electricity supplies to some areas into the bargain. The sound of chain saws was to be heard around the county from shortly after dawn as road clearance teams got into action. As I pen this note there is still much clearing up and repair work to be done to walls, fences, hedges and gardens.

We provide information to individuals or friends and family who need a helping hand to find out about the services and support available. We always try and find an answer, whatever the question. Our POPP team have a large list of contacts and information on a variety of topics, including: Fire Service home safety checks, health services, carers support, home aids, home care, social activities, food, transport and benefits. If asked for help, we can arrange to visit you at your home and listen to your needs and discuss any concerns you have.

Never imagine that your query is too complex or too small. There are so many services in Dorset, we may be able to tell you about one that you were not aware of and many are free of charge. We don't know everything, but if you ask us something we will make every effort to get the information you need.



Dorset POPP also provide Champions to help the over 50's. Champions support the development of clubs and services in partnership with local communities. When Wayfinders find a gap in the provision of a service, they will inform a POPP Champion to see if they can help. Funding is currently available to support new initiatives for the over 50s. Dorset POPP has funded over 200 projects, from lunch clubs to activities for carers.


