TRAFFIC CONVICTIONS

Dorset Police are constantly working hard to crack down on traffic offences that often cause so many serious issues on the roads around our communities. Here are some of the latest convictions released by the Courts from the Blandford area:

GAVIN PATRICK LEWIS, aged 49, of Winterborne Kingston. Admitted driving a vehicle after consuming so much alcohol that

the proportion of it in blood was 120 milligrammes of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood. The legal limit is 80 milligrammes of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood. Fined £300 and ordered to pay costs of £85. Disqualified from holding or obtaining a driving licence for 14 months.

DAVID ROUTH, aged 46, of Shroton. Admitted driving a vehicle after consuming so much alcohol that the proportion of it in breath was 61 microgrammes of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath. The legal limit is 35 microgrammes of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath. Fined £300 and ordered to pay costs of £85. Disqualified from holding or obtaining a driving licence for 17 months.

CHARLOTTE STEWART, aged 31, of Milborne St Andrew. Admitted driving a vehicle after consuming so much alcohol that the proportion of it in breath was 69 microgrammes of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath. The legal limit is 35 microgrammes of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath. Committed to prison for 10 weeks suspended for 12 months with alcohol treatment requirement for 6 months. Ordered to pay costs of £50. Disqualified from holding or obtaining a driving licence for 36 months. Also admitted driving whilst disqualified. Committed to prison for 10 weeks concurrent suspended for 12 months with requirement as above. Also admitted using a motor vehicle on a road / public place without third party insurance. No separate penalty.

RUTH JOANNA DAVIDSON, aged 35, of Blandford Camp. Admitted driving a vehicle on the A350 at Spetisbury at a speed exceeding 30mph. Fined £100 and ordered to pay costs of £85. Driving record endorsed with 3 penalty points.
